6	("ADMINISTRATIVE CODE"); AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN		
7	THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

9	WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Health		
10	Resources and Services Administration, HIV/AIDS Bureau now requires planning		
11	councils to establish term limits and membership rotations to ensure each planning		
12	council reflects the demographics of that jurisdiction's population of individuals with HIV		
13	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida		
14	("Board"), desires to amend Section 12.109 of the Broward County Administrative Code		
15	to specify HIV Health Services Planning Council ("Council") members' term limits and		
16	membership rotations; and		
17	WHEREAS, the Board finds that the proposed revisions to Section 12.109 of the		
18	Broward County Administrative Code are in the best interest of Broward County, NOW		
19	THEREFORE,		
20	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF		
21	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:		

Section 1. Section 12.109 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

12.109. Terms of Office and Compensation.

Terms of the Each Council members shall be in accordance with appointed for a three (3) year term, subject to the provisions of Section 1-233, Broward County Code. Following any three (3) consecutive terms, an individual is ineligible to serve for one (1) year, after which time that individual may be reappointed to the Council. The attendance requirement found in Section 1-233, Broward County Code, shall apply to the members of the Council to the extent an absence of a member is not the result of a member's HIV status. Council members shall not be subject to the provisions of Section 1-233(c), Broward County Code. The members of the Council shall serve without pay.

Section 2. Severability.

If any portion of this Administrative Code Resolution is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Administrative Code Resolution. If any court determines that this Administrative Code Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Administrative Code Resolution to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 3. Inclusion in the Broward County Administrative Code.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Administrative Code Resolution become part of the Broward County Administrative Code as of the effective date. The sections of this Administrative Code Resolution may be

renumbered or relettered and the word "resolution" may be changed to "section," "article,"
or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish
such intention.

Section 4. Effective Date.

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This Administrative Code Resolution is effective upon adoption.

EMA Term Limits for Ad-Hoc Committee

Central Florida HIV Planning Council

- A member term shall be 2 years, with approximately 50% of members recommended to the CEO for membership in even-numbered years and 50% in odd-numbered years.
- An individual shall not serve more than 3 full terms without a break in membership of at least 12 consecutive months.
 - If a member resigns or otherwise vacates a seat before the expiration of his or her term, a replacement shall be appointed to serve the remainder of the term.
 - A member who fills an unexpired term may serve a maximum of six consecutive years on the Planning Council prior to a break of at least 12 months, based on County requirements.
- Term limits shall not apply to a member who is the only person who can fill a required slot.
- A waiver of the six-year time limit shall be sought from the County where necessary.

San Francisco HIV Community Planning Council

- The term of office on the Council shall be two years.
- The term of appointment for Council Members shall be two years beginning on the date of the mayoral appointment.

Cuyahoga Regional HIV Health Services Ryan White Planning Council (Cleveland, Ohio)

- The term of office shall be for an initial period of two (2) years for newly appointed members, followed by a three (3) year second term and subsequent terms thereafter.
 - Upon completion of the three-year term, an individual is eligible to immediately reapply for Planning Council membership for one (1) additional three-year term.
- Planning Council membership shall not exceed three (3) consecutive terms without a minimum of one-year off before the individual can re-apply, with

allowance for extension of the last term as a voting member until a suitable candidate is found and appointed.

Boston EMA Ryan White Part A HIV Health Services Planning Council

- The Planning Council membership term is a period of twenty-four (24) months.
 - Members are eligible to renew their membership at the end of a term
 - Term limits are such that a member may serve for three terms consecutively before stepping away from the Planning Council for at least twelve (12) months.
 - Term limits may be waived by MNC (Membership and Nominations Committee) if doing so would keep the Planning Council in compliance with mandated reflectiveness.
- Any individual who is appointed to fulfill a membership term within six (6)
 months or less of the end of a term, the remainder of the term then in
 progress and the following full term shall be considered that individual's
 first membership term.

Metropolitan Washington Regional Ryan White Planning Council

- Each public member of the Council shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years; provided, the initial appointments to the Council shall be staggered such that fifteen (15) of the public members shall be appointed for terms of three (3) years and fifteen (15) of the public members shall be appointed for terms of two (2) years.
- Any member in good standing is eligible for reappointment. The Membership & Bylaws Committee, using its established process, will make recommendations to the Mayor's Office of Talent and Appointments.
- Members may be appointed to fill unexpired terms as vacancies occur.

Las Vegas Transitional Grant Area Ryan White Part A Planning Council

 All terms of voting membership shall be for two years and shall commence upon the date of BCC (Clark County Board of Commissioners) approval.

- Members may serve consecutive terms if they meet all membership requirements, successfully complete the application and nomination process, and are reappointed by the BCC.
- Term limits for planning council members shall be as follows:
 - No planning council member shall hold a voting seat for more than four, 2-year terms.
 - A planning council member who holds a voting seat for a total of 8
 consecutive years will be required to leave the council for 1 year and
 will be eligible to reapply for the planning council for no more than 2
 additional terms (4 years).
